**Title: The Global Mobility of Veterinary Experts and Expertise to and from the United Kingdom**



## Invited Speaker: **Gareth Enticott**

Cardiff University - UK

**Brief info:** Gareth Enticott is a Reader in Human Geography at Cardiff University, UK. His research examines the management of bovine Tuberculosis in the United Kingdom and New Zealand. Specifically, he has published papers on farmers' understandings of disease, farmers' use of biosecurity, veterinary behaviour and the use of diagnostics, the changing governance of animal disease, and the mobility of veterinary experts and expertise.

**Presentation description:** Vets are part of a global profession in which experts and their expertise are highly mobile. In this seminar, the reasons and impacts of the global mobility of the veterinary profession are analysed. The paper examines why so many vets in the United Kingdom are migrating to New Zealand; why over 50% of all new vets in the UK are from Europe; and how 'Brexit' may affect the provision of veterinary services in the UK.
